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**FEES: OVERWEIGHT OR OVERSIZE PERMITS**

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**OVER-DIMENSIONAL/OVERWEIGHT PERMIT CONDITIONS**

- A. Where a permit is issued with respect to:
- Height: The load shall not be composed of articles loaded one on top of the other.
  - Width: The load shall not be composed of articles loaded side by side or crosswise.
  - Length: The load shall not be composed of articles loaded one behind the other and any overhang to the rear shall not exceed 4.65m from the centre of the rearmost axle unless otherwise stated.
  - Weight: The loads shall not be composed of more than one article. When crossing bridges, all bridge postings and load restrictions pursuant to Part VII of the Highway Traffic Act apply.
- B. Vehicles and loads in excess of the width and/or length prescribed under Section 109 of the Highway Traffic Act shall be marked with four or more flags - one as near as practicable to each corner of the vehicle or load. The flags shall be bright red or orange in colour and shall be not less than 40 cm square. Where a vehicle or load is wider at any point or points on either side than at the corner, it shall, where practicable, be so marked with such a flag at the widest point on each side. Amber lights are required at widest points, ½ hour before sunset to ½ hour after sunrise and must be visible from 150 meters.
- C. Vehicles and loads in excess of the length prescribed under Section 109 of the Highway Traffic Act shall, in addition to the flags required under Condition B, display on the rear in a clearly visible position, a sign bearing the words "Long Load" in black letters at least 200 mm high with lines forming the letters at least 30 mm wide on a yellow background. The sign is to be removed or covered when not in use.
- D. Notwithstanding Ontario Regulation 614, where the permit specifically provides for exemption, loads may be moved under this permit provided they are firmly bound, or otherwise secured, or loaded in such a manner that no portion of the load may become dislodged or fall from the motor vehicle or trailer on which they are being transported.
- E. Escort Vehicle: where a permit is issued on condition the permit holder provide an escort vehicle and/or the width of the load is in excess of 4.00 metres, the load must be escorted by the Ontario Provincial Police. All arrangements and associated costs for O.P.P. escort services are the responsibility of the applicant.
- F. Movements shall not be permitted as follows:
- i. no movements of any kind on Saturdays, Sundays or statutory holidays
  - ii. no movements of any kind in or around school bus loading zones from 08:00 to 09:00 and 15:30 to 16:30
  - iii. no movement of any kind from one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sunrise or at any other time when, due to insufficient light or unfavourable atmospheric conditions, persons and vehicles on the highway are not clearly discernable at a distance of 150 metres or less.
- G. Any and all movements shall be carried out so as to not unduly obstruct traffic. Blocking of traffic shall be and is hereby prohibited unless conducted by an Ontario Provincial Police officer in uniform.
- H. For the purposes of Section 110(7) of the Highway Traffic Act, the provisions of By-law No. 2004-10 shall be deemed to be conditions of each and every permit issued.
